

Anticipation – Prediction Guide

Read each statement and:

- 1) Under the “**ME**” column, mark (+) if you agree with the statement; OR mark (-) if you do not agree
- 2) When time is called, discuss each statement within your group and:
 - Reach a general group consensus; do NOT change your own responses in the first column.
 - Under the “**WE**” column, mark (+) if your group generally agrees with the statement; OR mark (-) if your group consensus is that the group does not agree with the statement.
- 3) After reading, discuss in your group how you think the author would respond to each statement; make your decisions BASED SOLELY ON THE STORY.
 - Reach a general group consensus; do NOT change your own responses in the first column or your group responses on the “**WE**” column.
 - Under the “**AUTHOR**” column, mark (+) if your group generally agrees with the statement; OR mark (-) if your group consensus is that the group does not agree with the statement. **Make sure you and your group can support your decisions with examples from the story.**
